







# Debt-ridden man kills friend to rob mobile worth Rs 1.5 lakh



Ahmedabad : Debt overhang is a burden worse than death itself, they say. Like this man, Madara town of Kutch district who was so mentally crippled by debts that he didn't think twice before killing his 25-year-old friend to rob the latter's new mobile phone worth Rs 1.5 lakh and repay some of his dues. The victim Kirti Thakkar's expensive gadget caught his friend Diven Chavda's attention and that led the latter to bump off his own friend. The incident came to light when the police found Thakkar's body near Bhukhi River on August 23.

Thakkar has been working as a computer technician in a local showroom for the past eight years. On August 22, he went to the market at around 8:30am after having dinner. When he did not return till 10pm, his mother called him and Thakkar told her he was coming home within five minutes. However, when Thakkar did not come home till around 11:30pm, his parents again called on his cellphone but this time it was not in the network coverage area. They, along with relatives searched for him till late at night but in vain.

The next morning, Thakkar's father got a call from his son's employer that his body was found near Bhukhi river. They found Thakkar in a pool of blood

prepared a separate list of people who seldom went there and Chavda's presence was confirmed at the spot. The police detained Chavda for interrogation and found that he had also tried to sell the robbed phone. Chavda is into forex trading and had earlier borrowed money from Thakkar too. The deceased had been asking Chavda to repay the loaned amount and this often led to heated arguments between them in the past. Chavda broke down and revealed he was in dire need of money and therefore hacked a plan to rob Thakkar's mobile.

On searching Chavda's house, the police recovered the mobile phone, the SIM card and the knife used in the murder.

## Cousins in love die by suicide

Ahmedabad : A love affair between two cousins came to an end after they committed suicide at the bank of Und river in Bharatpur village of Jamnagar by consuming poison on Thursday. The deceased, Sudha Savasadiya (19) and Ajar Savasadiya (26) took this step because the social customs did not permit them to marry. Kanji Savasadiya, Sudha's father, had earlier said that Sudha was engaged to a man in Dhol but the couple continued to see each other secretly.

**In-laws looked for abetting woman's suicide**  
Rajkot: In-laws of a 24-year-old woman, Rekha Chandravanshi were booked after she committed suicide by hanging in Junagadh on August 22. Chandravanshi was a mother of two and was physically harassed by her in-laws for dowry. A complaint was filed by her sister, Pitkanika against Rekha's husband Ganant, mother-in-law, Geeta

and sister-in-law, Anjali. Rekha was a native of Nepal and got married eight years back.

**Chana destroyed**  
Rajkot: Four tonnes of snack item were destroyed by the health officers of the Rajkot Municipal Corporation. The stock of chana gur garam (roasted chickpeas) that was supposed to go to the market for snack-making was found to be rotten and infested with fungus and insects. The officers raided the R 5 Ghuh Duhog located on the banks of the Aji river on Dudhsagar road. It was also discovered that the stock had started decaying and was fried in unhygienic reused oil.

## Two cousins drown in Aji dam

Ahmedabad : Two cousins died of drowning in Aji dam in Rajkot on Thursday. The deceased were identified as 12-year-old Mumtaz Parivar and cousin Heer Parihar (14).

According to Aji Dam police, the two girls along with their five other cousins had come for a picnic at the dam. While the cousins were playing in the water, Mumtaz and Heer went into deeper water and started drowning. The other cousins called the fire brigade which reached the spot and started search operation.

Yadavale then did his Master in Science at MS University and went on to pursue his doctorate studies from the Tata Institute of Fundamental Research (TIFR) in Mumbai. He went to the Centre for Astrophysics, Harvard University, USA, for post doctoral fellowship before returning to India and joining the Physical Research Laboratory (PRL) in 2005.

Swaraj Ashram was founded by late Swaraj Ashram and played a key role in the independence movement and tribal education. Jugraj Dave, a freedom fighter and follower of Mahatma Gandhi spent his life working at the Ashram.

# Gujarat: In twin delight, get a glimpse of lions, tigers near Statue of Unity

VADODARA / AHMEDABAD: Two majestic wild cats - Asiatic lions and tigers - will be roaming in the picturesque valley of Satpara and Vindhyachal hill ranges near the towering Statue of Unity in Kevadiya. An open jungle safari where visitors can see lions and tigers from up close will open up at Kevadiya, where one such facility has already become a star attraction for those visiting SOU. Sources said the proposed safari will be double the size of the existing one, which is spread over 375 acres and also houses a geodesic dome aviary. The forest department, which is developing the project, has sought expertise from the Green's Zoological Reserve And Rehabilitation Kingdom, an NGO run by Reliance Industries Ltd. The safari is being developed on the lines

of Devaliya in Gir as an open zoo wherein tigers and lions will move around freely in a natural habitat. Tourists can either take a bus ride or open jeep to see the animals. Two pairs of tigers will be zoo-bred and brought here under animal exchange programs from some other zoos in exchange for lions.

"Once the land is acquired, the forest department will prepare a proposal and send it to Central Zoo Authority of India. For lions, we only need to shift two pairs from the existing one, which is spread over 375 acres and also houses a geodesic dome aviary. The forest department will need nearly 700 acres of land for this safari. Officials in the Statue of Unity area Development and Tourism Government Authority (SOJADTGA) said that land acquisition for project has

started. Parimal Nathwani, MP and director, corporate affairs, RIL said, "We are not associated with the project and wouldn't like to comment. It is astute government project."

This open safari will come up near Nagatpuri Kethi village, 15 km off Kevadiya. The decision for open safari near Kevadiya was taken in 2018 but dropped in 2022 after the jungle safari became operational. An open jungle safari where visitors can see lions and tigers from up close will come up at Kevadiya, where one such facility has already become a star attraction for those visiting SOU. Sources said the proposed safari will be double the size of the existing one, which is spread over 375 acres and also houses a geodesic dome aviary.

# If you're caste biased, your degree is flawed: Minister

Ahmedabad : Veer Namad South Gujarat University (VNSGU) organised its 54th Spoken Convention held at Surat on Thursday where 31,748 degrees were conferred to students.
